- Check out The Centenary Centre, Newcastle's largest antique centre, offering a wide range of antique collectables, vintage and estate jewellery, books, tools, gifts, art and decorator items. There are over 25 Shops under the one roof, The Centenary Centre provides customers a wide selection of antique and collectible items including furniture, art, ceramics, deco, retro, jewellery, glass, militaria, linen, toys, ephemera, tools, books and a huge variety of collectables from the 1780's to the 1980's. The antique collectibles are displayed in the centre in such a way that browsing is encouraged and provides a delightful way to spend a few hours. Located just behind the Crowne Plaza Hotel on the Harbour Foreshore in the heart of Newcastle, The Centenary Centre is open 7 days from 10am until 5pm.

- Encore Boutique for recycled clothing (376 King Street, Newcastle).
